J. PRESENTATIONS AND REPORTS

J.1 Presentations

J.1.1 Blessed and Beloved – Cristina Corbett, Special Assignment Teacher

Director Weltz introduced Special Assignment teacher Cristina Corbett. C. Corbett shared her presentation on the Blessed & Beloved program. This new Family Life Education program is based on the 2023 Ontario Catholic Education Curriculum Policy document and will be combined with the religion program in grade 1 classrooms across the board this year, and all elementary classrooms by 2027. She further described the format of the new program, the implementation plan, and how educators can access resources online.

The Chair thanked the presenter for her work and for joining the meeting this evening.

J.1.2 Student Enrolment – Daphne Brumwell and Jennifer Dunkley, Superintendents of Education **Director Weltz**

The Superintendents of Education provided an overview of current enrolment by elementary and secondary sectors as well as individually by school. This included information associated with each school including, projected vs. actual enrolment, qualified vs. unqualified staff, numeracy and literacy leads, and identifications of math priority schools by grade where applicable.

A decrease of 37 elementary and 5.9 secondary student FTE and its effects on the 2024-2025 were shared. A continued staffing shortage of certified educators in communities across the district is limiting the board's ability to welcome new students and their families to NCDSB schools which was cited as the main cause of the first decrease in enrolment in many years. Trustees engaged in a question and-answer period with the presenters and Superintendent Keld Scott.

Chair Sheculski thanked the board for their work on this topic.

J.1.3 Summer Learning – Andrea Iserhoff, Principal, Aileen Wright English Catholic School Director Weltz welcomed Andrea Iserhoff, Principal of Aileen Wright English Catholic School in Cochrane, to present an overview of the summer learning program that was offered to students in Cochrane this past summer. A. Iserhoff shared that 19 students in Cochrane engaged in many different learning opportunities and activities designed to enhance their literacy and mathematics development. The presentation also included student work samples and data to further demonstrate the positive outcomes of the summer program.

J.2.10.1 Facilities Update

Director Weltz referred to item#14 in the *Board Package* and provided an update on several Facilities matters such as, summer projects, St. Joseph Childcare and plans for the future.

The Board heard an update on Summer Projects throughout the district. T. Weltz shared that all projects continue to be ongoing due primarily to material delays. All work will continue during the summer break in 2025 as the work cannot be done while school is in session.

An update on the continuing work on the St. Joseph School Childcare project was shared. Work continues and a new projected completion date of January 2025 has been set.

T. Weltz also reported that facility planning is currently underway to develop a new five-year plan that must first address fundamental materials that are end-of-life in our schools (boilers, windows, roofing, doors, etc.), then possible additional priorities like gymnasium upgrades, playground revitalization, and enhanced curb appeal. She reminded trustees that the ventilation projects over the last several years required significant resources limiting the Board's ability to attend to other projects.
