


Make Reading A Part Of Your Family Time!


How To Read With A Beginning Reader:

Encourage your child to use his/her finger to point to each word Read a sentence and have your child repeat it

- Take turns reading a sentence each or a page each. Talk about the story as you read it. What do you think happen next? What does this story remind you of? will
- How do you think this character feels? Don't be afraid to read the same book again! Repeated reading helps build reading fluency!

Check For Understanding


- Start the book by making predictions. V

YELLOW is for the sun so bright, **ORANGE** is for the edge of the night.


BLACK is for the sins we made, WIEIITIE is for the grace he gave.
